3. TECHNICAL SERVICES SUPPORT AND LAND USE AGREEMENTS FOR MULTI-COMPLETION MONITORING WELL INSTALLATION

The first multi completion groundwater monitoring well is planned for installation in the Wyandotte Creek subbasin near Lone Tree Road and Circle G Ranch Road. The well will using hourly data collectors from different zones of the aquifer to understand groundwater level conditions are varying depths from the ground surface. DWR is funding the majority of the project through the DWR Technical Services Support (TSS) Program. The Wyandotte Creek GSA is funding the well drilling permit fee. Execution of the TSS and land use agreements are required before well drilling can begin. The GSA's legal counsel, the GSA Board and the landowner have previously reviewed these agreements and had no suggested changes to the language.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Board make a motion to 1. Approve the TSS agreement and authorize the GSA Administrator to sign the agreement. 2. Approve the land use agreement and authorize the GSA Administrator to sign the agreement.

4. APPROVAL OF MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT WITH LANDOWNER OF THE NEW MULIT-COMPLETION MONITORING WELL FROM DWR'S TECHNICAL SERVICES SUPPORT PROGRAM

The first multi completion groundwater monitoring well is planned for installation in the Wyandotte Creek subbasin near Lone Tree Road and Circle G Ranch Road. The well will use hourly data loggers to understand groundwater level conditions from different zones of the aquifer. DWR is funding the majority of the project through the DWR Technical Services Support (TSS) Program. The Wyandotte Creek GSA is funding the well drilling permit fee. Execution of the TSS and land use agreements are required before well drilling can begin. The GSA's legal counsel, upon review of the agreements suggested entering in to a separate recordable Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the landowner to ensure the GSA retains rights to

access the well in the event the property changes ownership in the future. Legal counsel drafted this MOA and the landowner has reviewed the MOA.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Board make a motion to approve the Memorandum of Agreement for the new multi-completion monitoring well from DWRs Technical Services Support Program Program.

5. APPROVAL OF THE NOTICE OF EXEMPTION FOR THE NEW MULTI_COMPLETION MONITORING WELL INSTALLATION THROUGH DWR'S TECHNICAL SERVICES SUPPORT PROGRAM

The first multi completion groundwater monitoring well is planned for installation in the Wyandotte Creek subbasin near Lone Tree Road and Circle G Ranch Road. The well will using hourly data collectors from different zones of the aquifer to understand groundwater level conditions are varying depths from the ground surface. A CEQA Notice of Exemption was filed by DWR for this project (attached for reference). The GSA's legal counsel reviewed DWR's NOE and suggested the GSA file a NOE also. The landowner has previously reviewed the NOE provided by DWR and legal counsel.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Board make a motion to approve the Notice of Exemption for the new multi-completion monitoring well installation through DWRs Technical Services Support Program
